

A Season of Light

The Christmas season always feels like a season of light. We're surrounded by light—the lighting of the town tree, the lights on our neighbors' houses, the lights lining our own rooftops (for those of us brave enough to climb up there).

The light of this season seems fitting, as Jesus had beautiful words to say about light. Matthew 5:14-16 records Jesus saying:

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

He is the light. His light shines through us. And, if we let that light be seen, it will show the world the glory of God.

Throughout our 18 years of working in El Salvador, the glory of God has been evident. We see the work that God has used to shine His light on our little mountain—clean water, good education for the community's children, Bible studies with our neighbors, homes made habitable. Just this week, we saw seven young people baptized in Jesus' name.

He has used SHIP's work to show His goodness and love in a community that often was shrouded in darkness. The work is difficult, and it isn't finished.

As we move into 2023, we reflect on the work He has already accomplished and anticipate the work to come. We have big plans for the near future:

- In January, we will welcome 15 new Kinder-4 students into our school and add an additional grade. For this to happen, we must provide scholarships for those new students, hire a teacher for our new third grade class, and hire an additional teachers' aide to help with daily administrative duties.
- We need to make repairs to our existing water well and drill an additional water well. These expenses will cost at least \$50,000.
- Our new classroom building has been growing rapidly, and each day brings a new buildingrelated project. We still have much to do to complete the building, and expenses for the building will cost around \$120,000.

At first glance, these numbers and the scope of the work seem overwhelming, but His light shines in the darkness, and He has given us a community of people, like you, who join with us to bring His light where it's needed most.

A Bream Fulfilled

In 2012, SHIP began its adventure in education. We were surprised to learn that school attendance was mandatory and free for children through the eighth grade, but after that, most of the of cost fell to the parents.

Visiting with neighborhood children, Robert Horton talked to a young lady about her plans for the upcoming school year. She told Robert that her education was over, because her mother simply couldn't afford to send her to school. Her mom was the sole support of four children and didn't have a source of income that would allow for paying for school.

That didn't sit well with Robert, and plans were made to provide scholarships at safe, private Christian schools for 6 children. One of those children was Ana, and on Monday, November 27, 2022, we joyfully watched as Ana received her university diploma. She earned a degree in Tourism with a minor in Languages (she speaks Spanish, English, and French). She has a good job, and we are incredibly proud of her.

This would not have been possible without the strong support of her sponsors, Jack and Gloria Matthews, who have encouraged and prayed and funded her education from high school through university.

A Light in the Darkness

One thing that always stands out to us when we're visiting El Salvador is how early it gets dark, and, because our property has so many large tree, the darkness there is dense. In another sense, this same area has been dark for many years because of the unrelenting violence of the gangs and the fear they instilled in our neighbors' hearts. The place in which we found ourselves was both physically and spiritually dark.

However, we knew that, even in the darkness, there was light—the light of Jesus. That's why we named our school Colegio La Luz de Jesús, the Light of Jesus School. At the beginning of each school day, we see these bright sparks of light coming together.

In our school they grow academically. They learn reading, arithmetic, English, and much more. They have school programs, and they have time to play in PE class. But, most importantly, they grow in love of God and of their neighbors. They learn how to live in peace, and they learn that they have a God who loves and will protect them.

What started in 2019 as a little school of around 25 students in two grade levels has grown to a school of over 70 students in five grade levels. In January, that little school will grow by 15 more students and expand to include third grade. We love welcoming the new students and welcoming back the returning students, but we mostly love that, with each grade added, we're welcoming in a new generation that loves and follows God.

Our September mission trip blessed us beyond belief. That's not the case at all; for quick reference, our oldest SHIP Tripper was 90, and our youngest was two months old!

What is so inspiring about mission trips is that we see the whole Body of Christ coming together, bringing experiences and talents and new ideas to our work. We get to see the way that Christ uses us—just as we are—to enrich our lives and the lives of those with whom we work. We see His glory and strength every time we take a group to El Salvador.

If you've been thinking about joining us on a SHIP Trip but felt hesitant for any reason (too young, too old, not enough construction know-how, whatever it is!), we're here to tell you that everyone can be used by God.
